This enevitable increase is the result of:

- cost of living increase which affects, travel, printing and salaries etc.
- . an increase in our public liability premiums.
- our quota to the World & Australian Associations being raised.
- an increase in the printing costs of publications and promotional materials.

Membership fees will therefore be:

October 1988 - \$11.00 April 1989 - \$11.00

There is \underline{no} increase in the April membership fees which remain at \$9.00 per girl member.

When you are telling your parents about this increase, please make them aware of the many benefits their daughters receive as members of the Girl Guides Association.






