5 YEAR LONG SERVICE AWARDS



Commissioners - for your information.

There seems to be some confusion concerning the issue of 5 Year Long Service Awards. The procedure is:

- 1. Fill out a 5 Year Long Service Award Form
- Take note of the Approval notice at the bottom of the form the District/Division or Region Commissioner may sign the bottom of the form (anywhere) and then the form may be taken or sent direct to the Guide Shop.

These awards do not need to be approved by H.Q. The commissioner then keeps the form for her district records.

In some areas, the Region Commissioner has a supply of these badges. You may obtain the badge from her - this saves a visit to the shop.

The 5 Year Award is only available to <u>leaders</u> who have not previously received an award.

Remember - you still need to send the forms for 10 / 20 / 30 / 40 year awards to H.Q. for approval.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION - Commissioners - please see that all leaders in all sections read this...

Overnight Stays - P.O.&R. Rule 38 1(e) Page 50

A leader who does not hold a camping certificate may hold an overnight stay in an approved hall or house. She must fill in the appropriate form to receive the necessary permission, have the correct leader-girl ratio present, and have an adult with First Aid experience present. The stay is for one night only and is usually preceded or followed by a special outing or activity.

The overnight stay is not a replacement for a camp or holiday. It does not require the extensive planning, programming and preparation of a camp or holiday. It is usually held locally, i.e. within the unit's own region, but permission may be given for an overnight stay outside the region for special events or outings—(i.e. Thinking Day, Greening Victoria, Skillorama, Gang Show etc., or visiting the penguins at Phillip Island or Sovereign Hill etc).

Two overnight stays may be held each year for two years, after which the leader is expected to gain her camping certificate. A leader holding a camping certificate may hold an overnight stay at any time, providing the usual permission is obtained.

Camping without a qualification -P.O.&R. Rule 38 (1) Page 49

This rule enables a leader to take eight of her guides or ranger guides away on a practice camp. The leader should have completed her campcraft training or have had adequate approved experience and she must fill in the appropriate form to gain the necessary permission. As for overnight stays, only two camps per year for two years are allowed under these conditions, after which she is expected to do her camping certificate assessment.

Camping Certificate - P.O.&R. Rule 39(1) Page 52

This is gained after a leader has done the appropriate holiday or campcraft training and has adequate experience as staff on approved camps or holidays. She is assessed by approved experts from the Outdoor Activities Department. The training and experience she receives prior to the assessment enables her to be responsible for the safety and well being of her girls for a period of at least 48 hours. She is able to offer a stimulating and challenging programme where the girls learn a variety of practical skills which will enable them to get the most out of their camp or holiday, as well as be of benefit to them later on. The girls also learn and put into practice such "life skills" as tolerance, cooperation, self-reliance and self confidence all necessary for successful community living.

There is a lot more to our camping programme than spending two nights away from home and a lot more to running a camp or holiday than there is in having an overnight stay coupled with an excursion. Unfortunately, there have been a few instances (in all sections of leaders abusing the first two of these rules - some deliberate and others through lack of understanding. If there are any questions about these rules, please do not hesitate to discuss the matter with me or a member of the State Outdoor Activities Committee.
