

From January 1st, 1988, young unemployed persons between 16 - 17 years will no longer be eligible for Unemployment benefits. They will, however, be eligible for JSA. JSA is Job Search Allowance, providing recipients with between \$25 - \$50 per week (rate determined according to parental income).

1988 BISCUIT PROMOTION

FACTS

A) Timing

- There will be 2 bakes, May and October. The promotion will again be launched through an insert in G.I.A. in the March issue. This insert will incorporate an Order Form for placement with Arnotts.

The close-off date for orders with Arnotts will be 22nd April with deliveries taking place during and before the end of May.

B) Pricing

- Unchanged on October 1987 promotion.
- C) Support Material The coloured poster and sellers work sheet will be available.

D) Shell Company

- Shell have agreed to permit us to approach their outlets throughout Victoria to seek support of the owners of service stations for guides/brownies to display and sell biscuits.

The key here is that service stations are self-owned businesses, and as such each will have to be convinced that they should support us in our endeavours. Naturally, Shell will be contacting their service stations directly, recommending that they support the promotion. You will have to convince the garages to support us in this way.

As you well know, one of the problems we have always had with Biscuits in the past was to point the general public to a particular place to purchase the item. This will be solved as our press and radio advertisements will now have a tag-line pointing the public to Shell service stations.

Work-sheets, will be produced identical to those developed in October for bowling clubs and CWA branches, paralleling Guide Regions, Divisions, Districts with the location of the Shell service stations. If you want to sell to bowling clubs and CWA clubs it should be done by the local districts.

A presentation file will be produced for each Region which will incorporate all details relating to the May Promotion. This would include a section on how to most effectively approach these service stations to gain their support, as well as suggested operational procedures on sales through these outlets, and ideas for doing that little extra at the service stations, i.e. seeking approval to have a special stall set up on a couple of occasions (manned by Guides).

Basically the display of Biscuits in service stations could involve a couple of cartons cut down (as you sometimes see in grocery stores) with a backer card (which will be specially produced for this Promotion) which will have provision for the price per packet to be written on. It would also be desirable to have one of the colour posters to be displayed on a window/door.

The Guide Unit or Association that has made contact with the service station would be responsible for making sure that stocks are available by regularly calling with fresh product. We cannot expect the service station to be involved in this aspect.

A stock control form will be developed for distribution which will enable Units or Local Associations involved to keep a record of stock placed at the service station. Sales made, it is recommended, will involve the service station simply ringing through their till as a normal transaction. At the conclusion of the promotion it would be a simple matter to tabulate stock delivered, less any left over, to arrive at a dollar figure for the Guide Unit.

E) P.R. Activity

- It would appear that for the 1987 Biscuit Promotion the bulk of orders placed on Arnotts were for sales already pre-made, and very little was for "speculative" selling.

However, now the introduction of a sales venue that we can direct the general public to (the Shell outlets), will necessitate those ordering to do some "speculative" ordering.

It has been decided that once again we time the P.R. and advertisements to break when stock is in the market place. This would involve the release of P.R. and advertising material during May, i.e. after the date for final orders has been reached. So please encourage districts to do some "speculative" ordering.
