A display of Britannia Park Memorabilia is planned and a self guided discovery trail is to be published.


The residents for that weekend will include two pack holidays: then and now, and two guide camps: then and now. They will welcome visitors between 10.00am and 2.30pm.

MINISTRY FOR THE ARTS
