Miss June Pobjoy - Trefoil Guild



Never a brownie or ranger, but enrolled as a guide at Pakenham. It was towards the end of the 2nd World War, and one thing I recall were the charts of aeroplanes and their identifiable markings, (including enemy planes) on the walls of the hall where we met. Pakenham had an airstrip and the guides and scouts with the local residents were rostered to record any plane flying over the area. I must have enjoyed my time as a guide, even though the company went into recess not long after I made my Promise, for later on I became a leader. My training was done by correspondence and I can remember doing the knot section, tying a clove hitch, timber hitch etc. around a match to send to the trainer. When I moved to Dandenong, I again became involved as a leader, camping adviser and trainer for guide section and campcraft.

I retired from active guiding when I went to work for Footscray Council in 1973, but kept a link as a member of the region campsite committee. Retiring from teaching in 1983, I found myself having 'little' jobs to do in the region. I joined the local trefoil guild in 1985. I live with my elderly father and have one married sister at Traralgon. My interests are knitting, gardening, music and church activities. I am glad to be back and really enjoying my role as Trefoil Guild Adviser.

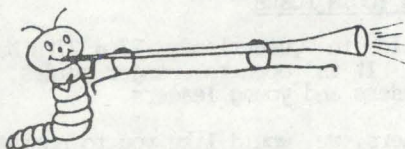

OCTOBER BISCUIT PROMOTION

Information will be given to region commissioners
and will also appear in August edition of Guiding
in Australia.

However, due to several new aspects which effect
the promotion for the first time, the following
will prepare your district when they plan their
biscuit drive.

1. An insert in GIA in August will incorporate:

- . full promotion details
- . the order form on Arnotts
- . form to order merchandising support
material
- . details of the "Recognition Programme"
- . support activity details

2. Orders to Arnotts must be lodged by 23rd Sept.

3. ANZ Banks will display and sell biscuits during
October. However, you will have to order
biscuits and take them to the banks. A list
will be given to your region commissioner.
There are 237 branches in Victoria. Let us try
to have biscuits in every branch. Keep
contacting the shell garages, bowling clubs and
CWA, as they may still be interested in selling
biscuits.

4. There has been a wholesale price increase. It
is recommended that biscuits be sold at \$1.30
per packet. If this is done, the following
will occur:

- . Wholesale price = 69c per packet
- . Rebate to Foundation & Vic. HQ - 15c
- . Sales Tax - 8.4c
- 92.40c
- . Recommended selling price - \$ 1.30
- . Profit - \$ 0.37.60c

The price increase should not be a negative
factor working against further sales
improvements.

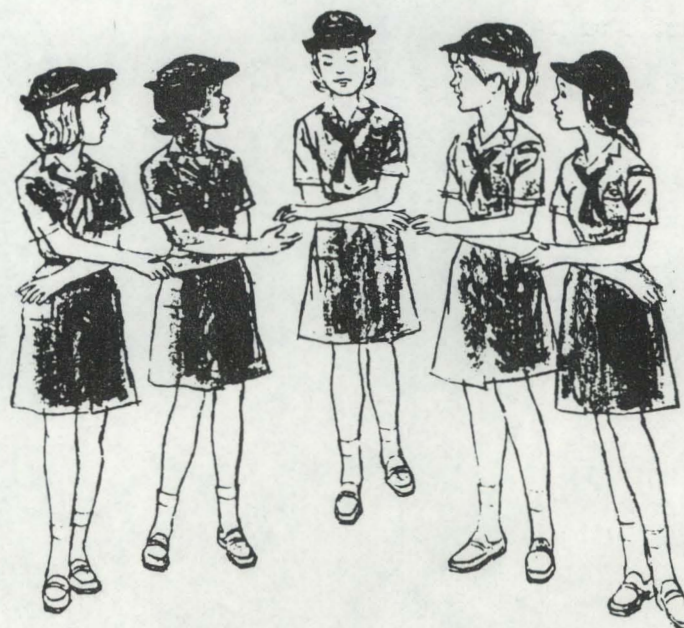


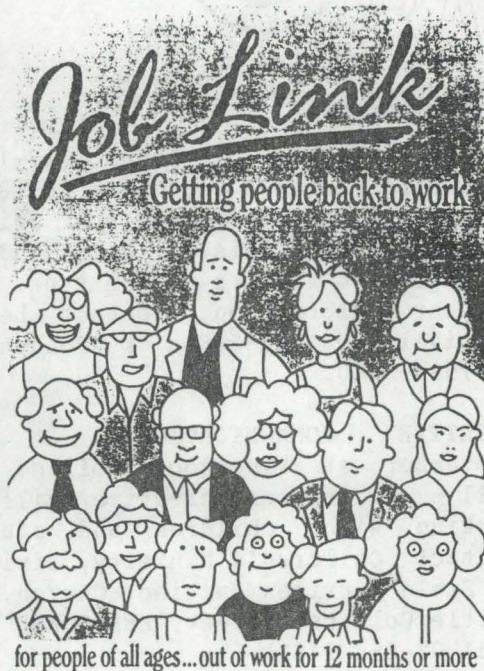

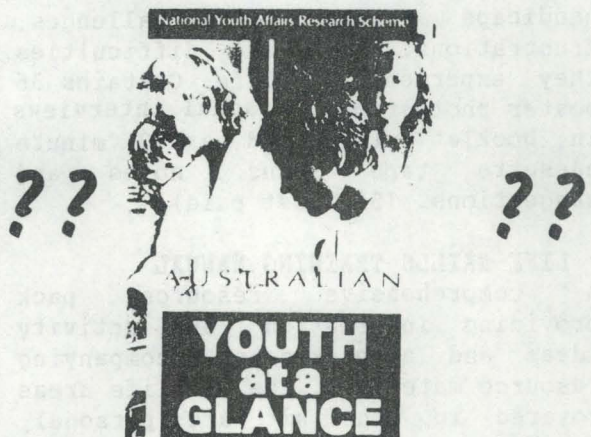


Did you know the number of young people in Australia's population has risen by over 2.5% in the past 27 years?

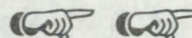

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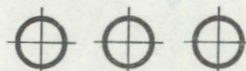
