TRAINING

WARRANTING

The age for warranting a leader from 1 July 1995 will be 18 years. We will continue to accept prospective leaders from age 17 for Leadership 2 training - they can then be ready for warranting when they reach 18. (Now you can drive, vote and become a leader!)

RECORDS AND FINANCE

An audio tape with supporting material on the topic of "Keeping records and recording your financial matters in the unit" has been produced. There will be a copy in each region as well as copies in the resource centre. Contact your region training co-ordinator or the resource centre if you wish to borrow the tape. Please use this material to help clarify your problems.

FIRST AID

State registered nurses need only attend

Part A of first aid training. Nurses and holders of certificates other than those which cover all clauses do need to be assessed for Part A and Part B to ascertain that all information is current and relevant to working with girls. Please arrange this through your region outdoor activities adviser. If in doubt about the need for assessment please contact the Training Department.

All recognised first aid courses, equivalent to Australia St John Ambulance and Red Cross, which issue certificates on satisfactory completion of the course will be acceptable alternatives to the appropriate clauses for health and first aid requirements for camp and camp first aid syllabus. As more organisations are offering first aid courses, it is important our members have the opportunity to cross-credit.

ALL leaders need to attend renewal training every three years and update CPR every year for their girl guide first aid qualifications to remain current.

LATE APPLICATIONS

Remember that applications for trainings close four weeks before the training is due to commence. Send your training forms in early. If you are not able to send the fee in at the same time, add a note saying 'money will follow'. Please remember to enclose a stamped self addressed envelope for the return of the acceptance sheet.

Little Women



Little Women is based on the beloved novel by Louisa May Alcott. Little Women is the story of a New England clan, the March family - a mother, and her four daughters caught in the enchanting years between girlhood and womanhood.
