BROWNIE GUIDES

GROUP BADGES FOR BROWNIE GUIDES

This is a new badge for brownie guides to work on together as a six, in an appropriate age group or as a unit. The tasks are shared rather than having each girl do each clause as with interest badges. Assessment is by the unit leader.

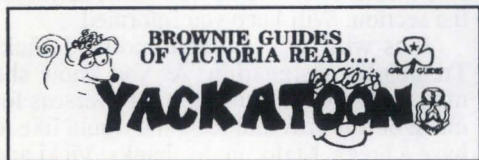
The badges come in four colours so that girls earning more than one have a choice of colour. They are designed so that the triangles fit together in a row across the sash at the top of the back.

Some interest badge syllabuses are able to be used. These are; Australia Family, Conservation, Entertainer, Outdoor Fun, Science, World Environment and World Friendship. A separate sheet containing other syllabuses is available in the guide shop.

This includes; Asia Pacific Awareness, Observation, Public Relations, Recycling and World Centres of Guiding.

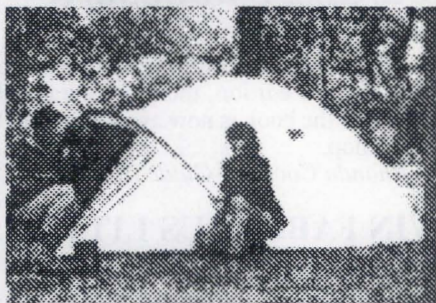

SUPPORT GROUP INFORMATION

By the time you read this copy of *Communicating* you will have received your invitation to the 'Fact and Fun' day at guide headquarters on Saturday 27 May. This day of information and support will greatly benefit your support group and district. Book early to ensure a place.

COUNTRY REGIONS

It is often difficult for support group members from country regions to travel to the city for the information days offered to them but do not despair, we will come to you. Put this suggestion to your district leader who can discuss it with the division commissioners and region commissioner.

GiA

Have you been able to subscribe to GiA for each one of your leaders? Many support groups have responded and as a consequence many more leaders

are receiving their own copy of GiA. It is important that they receive this magazine each month as not only does it contain articles of interest to them and program ideas but it is now the only way for them to receive *Communicating*. Please make sure that they all receive it.

SUPPORT GROUP MEETINGS

It is not always easy to get a great number of parents along to our meeting each month. Try this idea. Every three or four months organise a meeting with a difference. Following on the business of the meeting arrange for a guest speaker, someone from the local community maybe to talk on health issues which affect all families; a father who would be interested in running a short session on handy hints for repairs around the home; maybe handy hints on how to fix those minor

problems with your car; someone within your district, division or region who is into craft ideas. I am sure that there are many more ideas that you can come up with. Ask among your parents to see what sort of things appeal to them.

WELCOMING NEW FAMILIES

Do you welcome new families to your district? How do you welcome them? With the new 'Parent Assistance Form' the fact that there is a new family in the district should be made known to you very shortly after they have joined. Put a system in place where the district leader and a member of the support group (I suggest a member from the unit which their daughter has joined) either visits the family or organises a meeting time at the hall so that the family can be officially welcomed to the district and it can be pointed out to them that they too have a part to play in guiding. Talk to them, let them see you are interested in them, you

never know it may be a potential recruiting ground for a new leader, a unit helper or a replacement for a retiring member of your support group committee. Welcome them early, let them know that guiding has much to offer them as parents as well as their daughters.

BUT DELIVERY INSTRUCTIONS CAN BE CHANGED from order to order to suit whoever is selling at the time. If two or more groups in the district need biscuits from the same bake, the delivery can be split to two addresses, **PROVIDED A MINIMUM OF 10 BOXES** is delivered to each point.....

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR DISTRICT LEADER INFORMED WHEN AND HOW MANY BISCUITS YOU ARE ORDERING.

THERE WILL NO LONGER BE SEPARATE ACCOUNTS FOR INDIVIDUAL UNITS/GROUPS.....except Trefoil Guilds/Regions etc.....all orders **MUST BE MADE** through the **DISTRICT ACCOUNT.**

All accounts **MUST BE PAID IN FULL** within 30 days of **DELIVERY.** This is a concession Arnott's extends to us to assist our membersnormal trading is 7 days.....so we **MUST NOT** allow things to drag on giving the Girl Guides Association a bad name.
