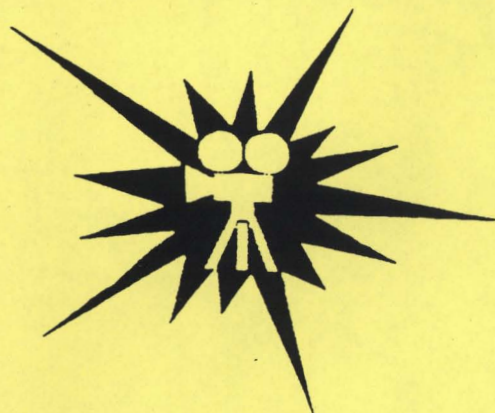
### PUBLIC RELATIONS IS YOU TALKING TO PEOPLE

## **TRAINING**

### **C.P.R.**

For a camping certificate to be current, CPR must be updated annually. Training Department offers courses taught by Red Cross trainers.

However, leaders are encouraged to seek trained personnel in their local area to fulfil this requirement. This may be a less expensive option. Perhaps region outdoor activities co-ordinators in consultation with region training co-ordinators could organise a day for their leaders.
