



The Story of Magic

Man's use of magic goes back at least 50,000 years. Prehistoric hunters, for example, probably used cave paintings of animals in rites intended to help them hunt the animals.


The ancient Greeks and Romans consulted priests called oracles, who interpreted advice from the gods and tried to tell the future from dreams.

According to one legend, the three wise men who visited the baby Jesus were astrologers who located Him by magic use of the stars. The Bible has many references to magic, sorcery and witchcraft.

During the Middle Ages, nearly all Europeans believed in magic. Clergymen considered magic sinful, but they believed in its power. Alchemists hoped to discover the philosopher's stone, a magic substance that could change iron, lead, and other metals into gold. They also tried to find the elixir of life, a miraculous substance that could cure disease and lengthen life.

Many forms of magic tried to predict the future. People believed a person's character could be described or his future foretold in various ways. These methods included studying the palm of his hand, his facial features, or even the moles on his skin. Some people used tarot cards, a set of playing cards with special pictures, for fortune telling.

Today, Gang Show does not rely on magic for these reasons. Rather we use the magic of the theatre to transport you to the places where dreams are made.



# Merlin, Man of Magic and Mystery

Once there was a very special place, frozen in time. It was called Camelot, a wondrous castle in England. This was where King Arthur his queen Guenevere and the Knights of the Round Table lived.

In Camelot life was wonderful and people were very happy. King Arthur and the knights protected them from danger and harm. They made sure that the poor shared the blessings of the rich, the weak were protected by the strong and that good triumphed over evil.

Much of the credit for this state of affairs was due to the Wizard, Merlin. He was King Arthur's special guide and friend with magical powers to help the King with his Kingdom.

Merlin first cast his magic and helped Arthur claim the throne by removing the magical sword, Excalibur, from the stone. From then until the end of Arthur's life, Merlin was his constant companion.

Whenever and wherever magic or mystery was required, Merlin could always be relied upon to whistle up just the right spell to suit the occasion. He could add magic to anything.

It's fitting that we've chosen Merlin to represent the spirit of magic in this year's Gang Show.



Two of the Greatest Magicians Aladdin

Strictly speaking Aladdin was not a magician himself. But he possessed a wondrous lamp that enabled him to make magic happen.

Whenever Aladdin wanted to create magic he rubbed his lamp to summon the Genie of the lamp. This genie could do almost anything that Aladdin asked.

With this amazing power, Aladdin was able to marry the king's daughter and live very happily. Unfortunately, one day his wife gave the lamp, away to an evil magician.

How Aladdin got back his magic lamp and rescued his wife is an exciting story and classic children's fable.

# Houdini

Harry Houdini was perhaps the most famous escape magician who ever lived.

He was an American who freed himself from police handcuffs, leg irons and locked gaol cells. On many occasions he was handcuffed and placed in a crate that was nailed shut and lowered into a river. On each occasion he escaped in a few seconds.

His special brand of magic was freeing himself from situations that would beat anybody else.

His magic was the way that he did it.





# The Curtain Rises . . . . .

but it sure takes a lot for it to!

When the final curtain falls this year, planning will start for Gang Show 1988. Production meetings will be held regularly with the format gradually taking shape.

Application forms for all departments will be printed and distributed later in the year and auditions and interviews conducted early in April.

The successful Cast applicants commence rehearsals early in May and there are usually two weekend ones, and a rehearsal of the first half, the second half and a full dress rehearsal in the theatre itself. And then comes Opening Night.

You mainly see during the performance those on stage. We'd like to tell you a little of what goes on behind, in front of, below and above the footlights.

You won't be reading this unless you have encountered our first line of Gang members, the **PROGRAMME SELLERS** without whose efforts these words would have been written in vain and who also offer Song Folios for you to recapture at home some of the melodies heard during the Show.

You were shown to your seat by members of the FRONT OF HOUSE team. To seat 1600 people each performance is no mean feat. Particularly when most of you arrive with less than 15 minutes before the start! Shame on you!

Box Office problems, tickets left to be collected or paid for, and messages are all dealt with effortlessly by them. Many have been Cast

members but time does not allow them to participate in that way so we are thankful for their continued interest.

The **LIGHTING** team is responsible for the tremendous effects you see on stage and if you could bug their communications set-up you would be forgiven if you thought that you were on your way to the moon, such is their technical jargon and expertise.

MAKE-UP is our underground movement and many of the Cast disappear down the staircase into the bowels of the theatre and reappear as completely different characters, all due to the deft hands of these talented people. They are specialists in character make-up and all the Cast receive general facial treatment. You men know how long it takes for one woman to do fhis - just think of over 100 and you will realise that it could be true to say pandemonium prevails but panic never.

PERSONNEL has a tremendous task even prior to the Show. This team keeps up-to-date lists of all Gang members, issues written instructions relative to rehearsals and works solidly on each occasion. Before each performance they make sure that everyone turns up. We have had instances of illness, accident and would you believe it, plain forgetfulness!

We have never had to cancel any item because someone is missing. Just ask any of the older members and they will tell you that the younger ones are word perfect, not just in their own items, but for most of the Show. Now that's enthusiasm for you, or is it ambition?

The people of the **PROPERTIES** have an unbelievable and unenviable task each year. They have to obtain the most odd assortment of hand props imaginable. Just try your hand at gathering together items from bookmaker's bags to football floggers and walking sticks to magic wand. Candidates for this department don't have to be relatives of Steptoe but an asset is to have the gift of the grab!

Now to relate to the P.R. set up. Pre-Gang Show publicity, radio interviews, television segments, promotions, posters and photography all come within the gambit of these publicity conscious people. Nothing short of turning people away would satisfy them, but we wouldn't be too happy. We want everybody to see and enjoy Gang Show.

A change of **SCENERY** now. It firstly has to be designed, manufactured and with the coordination of the STAGEHANDS put in the right place on stage and on time! It's a revelation to see their speed of movement, something like controlled panic, when the curtain comes down at the end of an item. What seems like minutes is, in facts, seconds only and you obviously appreciate the professional-like ease which changes the scenery and the mood of an item.

Each Gang Show is recorded history and each performance is taped by experts. You will see the details of how you can obtain these limited releases elsewhere in the programme.

Last in an alphabetical sense only as far as this article is concerned is the WARDBROBE department. Apart from design and manufacture there is maintenance during the show. Cast members in a tearing hurry, in a material sense, get running repairs. There is also a pressing need and many hours are spent over hot irons.

What's yours? Coffee, tea or you know what. The PARENTS AND SUPPORTERS ASSOCIATION relieves the thirsty moments, before, during and almost after our Show. Theirs is a pour show but appreciated by all. They cater at every rehearsal, make costumes and do a 1000 other things.

It would take a lot more space to tell the Gang Show story in more detail. We've probably missed somebody, but this won't stop them playing their part for the team's the thing and our thing is Gang Show.






