



This year the Technical Department has utilised staging methods never before applied at Gang Show. Each year the department is challenged to create the mood for each fresh act, a task that the show's technical director, Trevor Howlett, takes in his stride. This year is no exception. Each of the acts has used new techniques to produce the fantastic effects you are seeing tonight. In the first act the mood for the *Jungle Book* is portrayed through a spectacular series of three-dimensional plywood cut-outs combined with a variety of full cloths and

cut cloths. These are enhanced through a spectacular lighting design. The first act was designed, painted and lit by Barrie Robinson.

Those who are regular Melbourne Gang Show attendees would recognise the "never before used" triangular staging in the second act. The three faces of this mobile staging are used to depict various stories within the act, from the "Farmer's Barn" to the vibrant "Market Place", and then the richly-decorated "Jewish Synagogue". The great benefit of this style of staging is that

the story and mood can flow through a simple spin and move you to a new scene. The second act has another new addition this year in the swathed stage curtaining. Three hundred metres of this material were purchased to create three full sets of curtains. Each curtain has three sets of material within itself. The curtains are flown in various positions within the stage to provide a medium for spectacular lighting effects. These

effects are in keeping with

the changing emotions on the set, such as the shift from a solemn famine funeral to a vibrant Jewish wedding. The second act was designed and painted by Nick Jones.

All of the work you see on this fantastic staging was painstakingly built by Melbourne Gang Show's staging crew at our store at Dandenong. Many weekends and nights were spent by this enthusiastic team, ensuring that each item was constructed on time and to specification.





Dressing for the jungle

More than half a kilometre of material has been used in the costumes to create the illusion which is Gang Show 1996.

It has been one of the most challenging assignments yet for Brett Wingfield, the creator of our 100 *Jungle Book* animals and all the other costumes in the show. Brett, head of the Gang Show costume department, has also been working at the same time to costume the Peninsula Light Operatic Society's production of 42nd Street. He says that Gang Show has many more headaches because it involves costuming two small musicals on a

Brett conceptualised the costumes many weeks ago and chose the materials with the help of a shop in Frankston who sourced the materials needed.

He says most of the animal costumes are made of the reverse side of track suit material. The tiger and main character costumes needed most work.

More than 80 wolves appear in the *Jungle Book* story, including Akela and Raksha. There are the Bandarlogs (16 monkeys), Bagheera (a black panther), Shere Khan (a tiger), Tabaqui (a jackal), not forgetting Kaa, the 15-metre-long rock python.

Brett says "the sewers have used enough thread to reach from here to the moon".

Another challenge was the decision to opt for two junior casts in the show. This was with the aim of reducing fatigue of younger cast members, as each junior cast member appears in alternate performances.

Brett and his team have to match up young people in sizes so that one set of costumes can be used on alternate performances.

The second Act, *Ruth*, had different sorts of challenges for Brett and his team because



most of the cast are on stage for the whole performance, but need to appear different as the performance progresses from scene to scene.
