

IT TAKES MANY HANDS TO MAKE LIGHT WORK AS YOU CAN SEE BY THE NUMBER OF TECHNICAL TEAM MEMBERS

The **Technical Division** of Melbourne Gang Show, headed by Technical Manager, **David Reeve** works closely with the Production and Design Teams to meet a common goal. The best doggone Melbourne Gang Show ever!!

Both the Darebin Arts and Entertainment Centre and the National Theatre are huge spaces and as loud as our cast might be, it's a fine balance between making our soloists heard, our full cast numbers being clear to the audience and balancing with the band. Add in Sketches and you can see just how complex and vitally important the **Audio** Team's task is.

**Martin Tyrrell** and his team are responsible for setting up and operating our sound system, with microphones and speakers, amplifiers, equalisers and effects racks. And that's just the equipment. The hard part is connecting everything to the mixer at the back of the theatre and fine tuning the whole system throughout the show. But for our dedicated team the proof is in the listening pleasure for you, the audience.

"Lets get this straight, you want a dapper 1950s Melbourne Cup crowd and a 1990s Festival crowd in the first Act and Every Cast member in the second act to be a different type of dog? No Problem"


**Faye Glew** and her hardworking **Costumes** Team spend a busy life manufacturing, modifying and obtaining costumes for our cast of 100 (many of whom will use 10 -12 costumes throughout the course of the show). Its a good thing they have Monday Nights, Weekend Rehearsals Working Bees and our Oakleigh Store to turn fabric of all shapes, types and colours into a cornucopia of fashion design. But it's not just hard work, the maintenance, storage, cleaning and construction of our costumes takes place with fun and frivolity.

Imagine Gang Show in the dark?

We wouldn't see the cast, even if we could hear them. But it's not like at home where a few power boards, a couple of lounge room dimmers and a few 60 watt globes allow us to get along. Try multiplying that by a million and it gives you some idea of what the complex and highly skilled task of Theatre Lighting is all about.

**Trevor Howlett** and his **Lighting** team are responsible for not only setting up a dozen lighting bars, focussing over one hundred and fifty lamps, of many shapes and sizes and plugging them into a control desk via dimmer rack that looks like an octopus on steroids. They also help design the effects of the show from a seedy night club, to a raucous disco, to daylight and even a shady back alley, maybe all in a matter of four scenes. Inside our theatre this team help create the sense that you can be any where at any time.



YOU CAN TELL A DOG BY IT'S MARK

Melbourne Gang Show's Makeup Team has been given the task of turning every cast member in the second act into a dog. Sue Nichols and her team have spent many hours watching truck loads of terriers, and reading about bookloads of bulldogs to prepare themselves for this task. Throw in hours of practice in terms of both application and design and they are ready for the show.

Theatre Makeup creates character in a discipline that takes years to perfect. Its a balance between lines and shading and compensation for lighting techniques so that it is possible to make you believe that our youngest cast member can be the oldest woman in the world, or the furriest dog, or the wickedest wife or...the list goes on.


When you see a cast member holding a sword be assured that it probably isn't real. It just looks that way. Colin Eaton and his Props team are our scavengers of the show. They use seemingly average materials scrounged from offcuts and leftovers to create hand held items that look better than the real thing. They also find things to dress the set (how many of you have a 1950s bookies bag under your bed?).

Every weekend, if you stop by the Dandenong Sets Store you can see amazing transformations. It might be pieces of timber into a fully accurate and structurally sound terrace houses, a perfectly painted, seedy back alleyway or a fully operational city park, complete with running water.

As you really imagine you can see that ship sailing into Station pier spare a thought for our Staging and Sets Construction team. You won't see them but they do more than work up a sweat during the show, changing life size sets from one scene to the next, in less time than it takes you to applaud the previous item, Paul Francis directs the changes with his well oiled men and women in black. If the sets transport you to another place and time then thank the Staging Team.

Want to re-live the show with our souvenir Video? Or perhaps you're in the show and need to know how much time you have

to get into your next costume. Only then will you begin to appreciate the work of one of our smaller departments headed by David Nathan.



TO ONE OF THE MANY PIECES OF SCENERY

Once the house lights go down and the orchestra plays its first melodies, it's the job of Jason De Voogd and his Stage Management team to control and coordinate all of the technical parts. People around the auditorium and backstage might seem to be listening to the latest CD but they are actually following a complex set of sound, lighting and staging cues which ensure that the show runs smoothly and the magic of theatre is not lost. That light just doesn't magically appear at the right time.

The "Tech Team" as they are affectionately called are vital to the success of Melbourne Gang Show and their professional level skills and talents may look easy but take a mountain of training and effort to perfect. We may concentrate on the Cast on stage but it is often the work of the whole Tech Team which binds it all together.

The scene is Melbourne 1998. In the midst of the Lygon Street Festa, exciting news breaks in Cafe Del Ponte owned by Ricardo Di Capo. Gabriella, his school teacher daughter, has become engaged to her Australian boyfriend Josh.

Leaving the restaurant, Gabriella and Josh return to the schoolroom in time for a rehearsal of the class performance of Virgil's Aenead. The children are confused by the story and make the rehearsals a trying time for all concerned.

But Ricardo understands the story. Like Aeneas he too has made a journey. Leaving his family in Italy in the late 1950's he came to Melbourne to start a new life, to write his story in the city's history. His first encounters with melbourne at Station Pier and the Melbourne Cup, were strange and puzzling. But Ricardo persevered and made his mark in the city, opening his own restaurant and starting a family.

Now faced with an inevitable final journey, he reviews his life and the pathways that have brought him to this time. The story of the Aenead, of journeys taken and of bridges crossed, is his story. And it is Gabby's story too, as she and Josh set out on their new life together.

In the end, Bridges is everyone's story.


