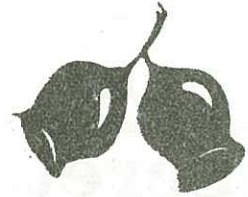

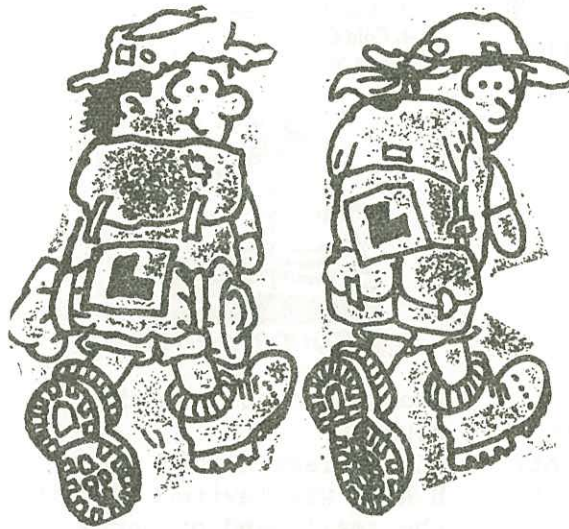

Come along and complete the challenge for the Promise and Law Section of your Jamborella Award.

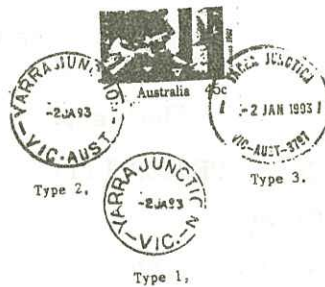
