With another twelve months behind us, a time of friendship, fellowship, challenge and service, I have the pleasure of presenting to you the 41st Annual Report of the Victorian Trefoil Guild.

With a special focus on attracting younger members to join the trefoil guilds we were pleased to see the start up of the C.L.A.A.S. (cadets, land, air and sea) trefoil guild, a group of very enthusiastic ex rangers etc who have generated interest in the "younger" age group joining our ranks.

Important events during 1993/94 were the 11th National Gathering of Trefoil Guilds held at Maritime College Tasmania with 30 plus members from Victoria attending. We also enjoyed the Asia Pacific Gathering of IFOFSAG held in Canberra during January 1994. Over 80 members enjoyed a very successful 24 Hour Gathering at Swan Hill held at the Pioneer Settlement which was organised and hosted by the Swan Hill Trefoil Guild. A Picnic in the Park held at the Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne.

Founders Day/Thinking Day at Wantirna organised and hosted by B.P.Scout Guild. Fellowship Day held at Williamstown hosted jointly by B.P.Scout Guild and Trefoil Guild.

Guide and training calendars and Communicating were packed at headquarters, and members continue to assist the training department with catering for training days, making and serving morning and afternoon teas to trainees.

On a State wide involvement, the guilds stock and man the "Trefoil Ship Shop" at the Sailing Centre. One member is responsible for the bookings for the use of the Sailing Centre. Members help stock and staff the trading tables at the Lady Murray Bowls Day, the Lady Delacombe Golf Day and the Cards Day. Members also do the lunches for the Tennis Day, and helped with the organisation of the Launch of Guide Month.

This year saw the introduction of the cravat an alternative to the scarf worn with the trefoil dress. Members enjoy being able to wear either scarf or cravat.

The response to the 1993/94 Service Project was excellent, and the Resource Centre is up and going at Girl Guide Headquarters.

A new award, Boronia Award, has been introduced for non-uniformed members of the Association. 5 and 15 year Long Service Awards have also been introduced.

The Robert & Olave Baden-Powell Trust Fund Committee have been looking into the Abbeyfield Housing Scheme. To those guilds who have seen a need and applied for assistance on members behalf, thank you. Please continue to seek assistance from the Trust Fund (through your Trefoil Guild Adviser) should you know of former members of Scouting or Guiding who could benefit from this Fund.

What a wonderful day we spent at Coolart with 2000 plus girls and leaders for the launch of Guide Month. I had the pleasure of visiting Bastin Park to celebrate part of Trefoil Week, planting trees and general tidying up of the area was carried out, followed by a bar-be-cue lunch.

Guilds have again financially supported guiding and community organisations. some direct to Headquarters or to guest speakers when invited to speak at various functions. I have listed those that I know of, and congratulate you all on the wonderful support you give .

Thank you to the guilds who have contributed to Victorian Administration, these donations, plus the 40 cents per member, and profit from the cards, is what we relied on to cover our expenses each year. 
In 1995 we can look forward to visiting Portland for the next 24 Hour Gathering, these gatherings have proved very popular, making new friends and catching up with the old.

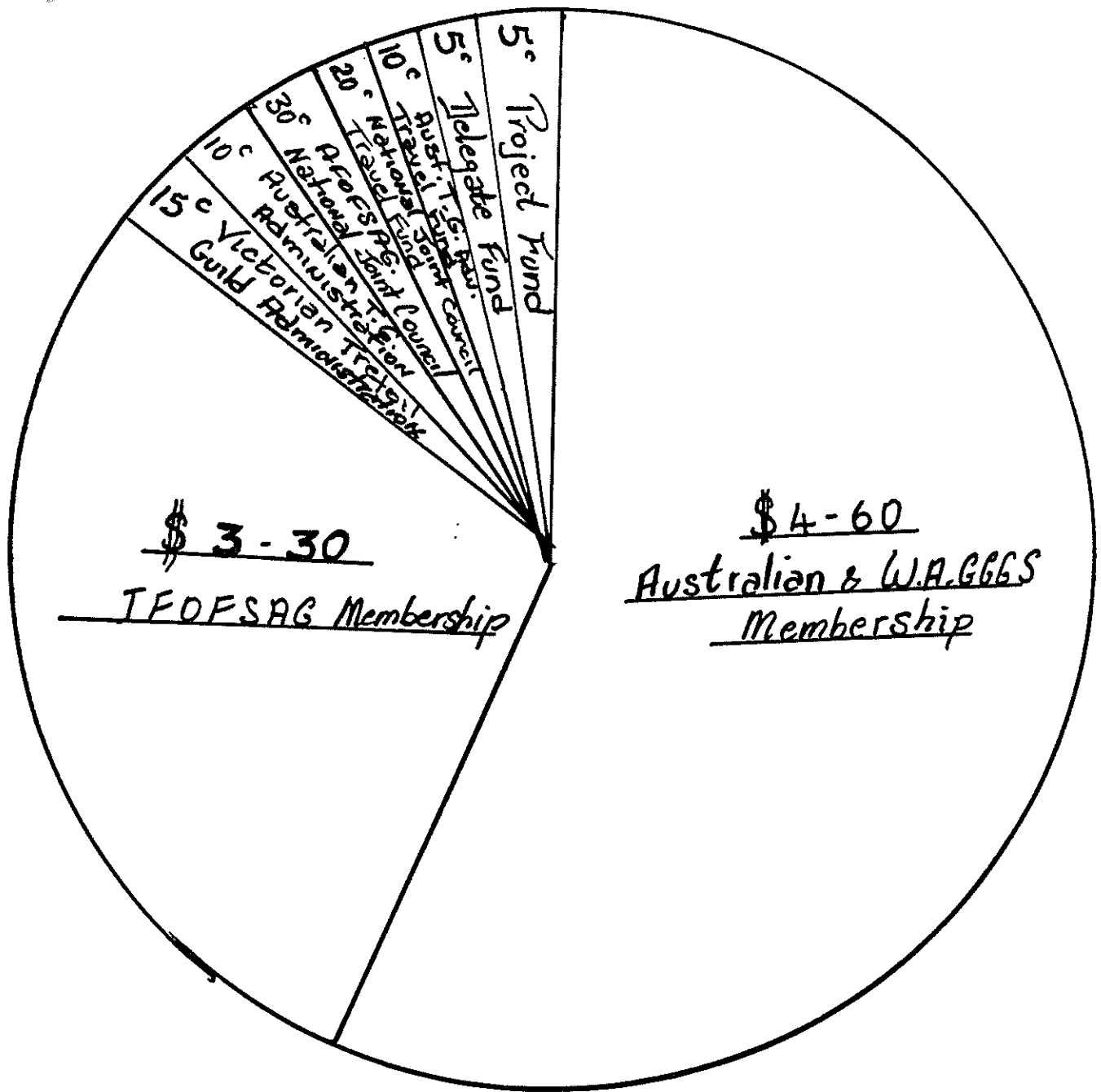

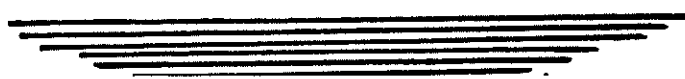

MINUTES OF THE VICTORIAN TREFOIL GUILD ANNUAL GENERAL
MEETING HELD ON 16TH OCTOBER, 1993
AT THE SALVATION ARMY CONFERENCE CENTRE, BORONIA.

Sixty-two trefoil guild members from 21 Trefoil Guilds attended the Annual General meeting.

Apologies were received and recorded in our attendance book.

A warm welcome was extended to Mrs Heather Barton our new State Commissioner.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS AGM held in 1992 were circulated prior to the meeting and were recorded as a true and correct record.

Mrs Shirley Reeves, Trefoil Guild Adviser read her report, and thanked all members for the tremendous support they gave to her, to guiding and to the community.

FINANCE- A financial statement showing receipts and expenditure was presented by the Treasurer and moved by Hilda Pullin and seconded by Freda Nelson that it be received as a true and correct record.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

LINK SCHEME: The response from Trefoil Guilds regarding the "Link Scheme" showed that Victoria did not see the need to follow this further. Shirley thanked all Trefoil Guilds for their response to the questionnaire, and will take the results to the Advisers meeting with Australian Trefoil Guild Adviser in January 1994.

SERVICE PROJECT FOR 1994 - After discussion it was agreed that guild members would continue with the calico dolls, the knitting for the prem.babies and the sale of stickers to "Give a Family a Break" project. It was also agreed that we would give financial support to purchase a Computer Package for the Resource Centre being set up at Girl Guide Headquarters. The total cost of the package being approx. \$4000.

TREFOIL DRESS - Agreed no changes necessary. Agreed that a navy cravat presented could be worn as an alternative to the present scarf. Members would have the choice of wearing either. Shirley to take the cravat to the Advisers meeting to see if other States interested.

24 HOUR GATHERING - 1994 - Swan Hill Trefoil trefoil guild have offered to host. Date to be advised.

1994 Annual General Meeting will be held at Girl Guide Headquarters and members are to notify Shirley whether they prefer mid-week or Saturday. Date to be notified.

CHRISTMAS CARDS - agreed that we purchase supplies for Christmas 1994 with the 1995 calendar and Trefoil Badge etc. on them. It was also agreed

to continue with the sale of correspondence cards, sympathy cards and wrapping paper.

State Commissioner, Mrs Heather Barton, thanked the Trefoil Guild members for their contribution to guiding and to the community. Heather spoke of her involvement in Guiding how she was looking forward to her term as State Commissioner, and although she had only been appointed very recently she had had the opportunity to see the Trefoil Guild members "up and about " and wished us well for the coming year. Heather suggested that all money for the Computer Package come to State Trefoil Guild Adviser and at the end of June 1994 a cheque be presented.

Elaine Wallbridge spoke about the changes in the adult uniform, and with the help of Pat Webb (Development Adviser), Gai Maddock (Gumnut Guide Adviser), Mandy Fitzgerald (Auslink and Guide Section committee member) and Mrs Margaret Fitzgerald (Support Group Adviser) modelled the formal and informal uniform being worn throughout Australia by adult members of the Association. We all agreed things have certainly changed. At the conclusion of the "parade" Elaine and models each received a small gift and our thanks for an excellent presentation.

Shirley Reeves thanked all for attending, and special thanks to her committee for the work they put into making this day a success. Guests were invited to join us for afternoon tea.

A small presentation was made to our State Commissioner, Mrs Heather Barton.

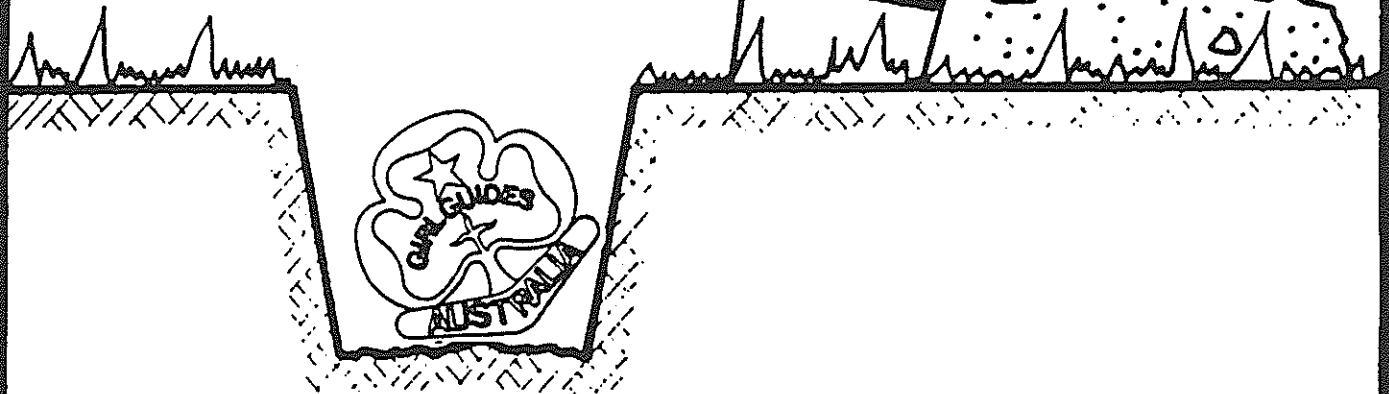

MEMBERSHIP

Full Membership is available to -

1. All members of the Girl Guide Association except those who hold a warrant or appointment or who are active in support groups.
2. Female members of the Scout Association who do not hold a warrant or appointment.
3. Former members of member countries of the World Association now resident in Australia.

Associate members may be those who hold warrants or appointments in the Girl Guide Association, active support group members who have made the Guide Promise, or female members of the Scout Association who hold warrants or appointments. Associate members may not hold office in a guild but may vote. They are required to pay guild subscriptions and national and international fees only.

THE TREFOIL GUILD SUPPORTS BOTH GUIDING AND THE COMMUNITY.

'Once a guide, always a guide' is especially applicable to the Trefoil Guild. The Trefoil Guild is a branch of the Girl Guides Association, especially formed to enable those enrolled as members of the Guide Movement, on ceasing to be active in the uniformed or support group sections, to maintain their interest and membership.
