State Projects

In 2010 we completed some of our State projects.

- The Quilts

The quilts were completed and after they had travelled the State including visiting the Art Gallery at Hamilton, an exhibition in Bendigo and the Rotary Quilt Show in Hawthorn (Melbourne) they were presented to three campsites for safekeeping. They have been placed as wall hangings at Iluka, Britannia Park and Lingbogol where members will be able to see them when they visit the sites.
