**ANNUAL REPORT 2012 - 2013** 



It is with pleasure that I present my first Annual Report for the Trefoil Guilds of Victoria.

On your behalf, I would like to thank Jan Allitt for all her service to Victorian Trefoil Guilds during her term as Adviser. She devoted a great deal of time and energy to this position and we are very grateful for all she did for the Victorian Trefoil Guilds and especially for her work in organising the National Gathering in Ballarat, her home city where we were made very welcome.

The Changeover of Advisers took place during the Trefoil Guild AGM in August 2012, a very happy gathering of Trefoil Guild members at the South Melbourne Community Centre. We were fortunate to have Barbara Dean, the Australian Trefoil Guild Adviser attend and preside over the changing of Advisers.

This year we welcomed two new Guilds –Springbacks and Yarra Valley Trefoil Guild. We farewelled members of Wannon River (Hamilton) Trefoil Guild thanking them for their many years of service to Girl Guides.

Our second Good Turn was to support KOGO (Knit One Give One) with their efforts to provide knitted items for a large number of community organisations. Whenever I went into Guide Centre I would also find bags of knitted items waiting for me. Thank you for your generous support. Many thanks to Vicki Callaway from Kinta Trefoil Guild who coordinated this activity. I hope many of you, like me, will continue to support KOGO.

The community organisations that Guilds support are many and varied, from overseas charities, such as the Mercy ships, to local families who also need a helping hand.

From January 2014 all members can access the newsletter by email or mail. I have started a Link (email) Trefoil Guild. This is not a Lones Group.
