FROM THE TRAINING DEPARTMENT

I do hope you have studied the training calendar for this year and have selected the courses that you will attend.

New application forms are now available from your region training co-ordinator and should be filled out carefully and forwarded direct to the training department. Forms should be accompanied by the training fee and an s.a.e.

District Leaders and Commissioners

"Leadership 2 for district leaders/commissioners" will cover all necessary knowledge of ceremonies and self-government through all sections and at the completion of the course warranting may take place - providing all other warrant requirements are met.

Leaders Changing Sections

Any leader changing sections should contact the training department giving all details of past experience so that in consultation with her district leader, the training adviser will arrange for a guiding partner to be appointed to cover all necessary section knowledge prior to warranting. The leader will no longer need to attend section time at a leadership course.

This arrangement should assist in the changeover period and re-warranting should be able to take place without delay.

Gummut Guide Leaders

Gummut guide leaders apply for Leadership 2 after completion of Orientation and Leadership 1. Warranting may then take place on completion of Leadership 2. Gummut guide units may open, providing there are two leaders prepared to undertake training as soon as possible.

Leadership 3 - one day for experienced leaders

Please note that this day will be the Sunday of each Leadership 3 course - not the Saturday as previously thought.

EASY STEPS TO HELP YOU TO HELP GUIDING BY JOINING
THE HBA GIRL GUIDES ASSOCIATION FUND RAISING PLAN

If you are an existing HBA member who pays through Easypay (direct debit from bank, building society, or credit union):

Go to your nearest HBA branch and say that you want to nominate the Girl Guides Association to receive a commission from your membership. OR

If you are an existing HBA member not paying by the direct debit system:

Go to your nearest HBA branch and say that you wish to change your method of payment to Easypay (direct debit from your bank, building society or credit union), and that you want to nominate the Girl Guides Association to receive a commission from your membership.

No bank charges apply to these debits.

HBA will then pay an ongoing 4% commission for your membership to the Association. OR

If you are a member of another health fund, you can transfer to HBA:

Go to your nearest HBA branch and fill out an application to transfer form, nominating payment by the direct debit system, and the Girl Guides Association, to receive a commission from your membership.

There will be no new qualifying periods applied, unless you upgrade your level of cover, and HBA will honour qualifying periods served with your current fund. OR

If you have no private health insurance, you can enrol with HBA.

Go to your nearest HBA branch and fill out an application form, nominating payment by the direct debit system and the Girl Guides Association to receive a commission from your membership.

The normal two month qualifying period will be waived, giving you immediate cover (except for pre-existing conditions).

HBA will pay a \$20.00 commission to the Girl Guides Association for each new member, plus an ongoing 4% commission.

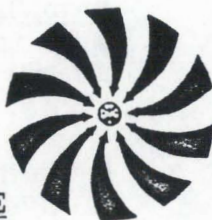

THINKING DAY MESSAGE

"A Guide is a friend to all and a sister to every other Guide" - the fourth Original Law gains extra significance on Thinking Day.

Regardless of race, religion, language or culture, eight million girls and young women worldwide all unite in common thought on 22 February each year.

Their commitment and solidarity is further expressed practically by donations made to the Thinking Day Contribution. These funds enable Girl Guides and Girl Scouts to promote further, the WAGGGS, its projects and programs.

Thinking Day Contributions made in 1990 enabled:

- . Four sub-regional seminars on environment and development in Africa which brought together three to six young leaders/rangers from 22 national organisations.
- . The Arab regional group to translate into Arabic, the WAGGGS publication "International Education: A Pathway to Understanding", so that this could be used by all members of the regional group.
- . Twenty three rangers/senior girl scouts from six member organisations in the Asia Pacific Region to participate in Environshop '90, to discuss "The Earth you save today, is your Earth tomorrow". As a result of this gathering, an environmentalist badge has been launched for members of the region.
- . Twenty four trainers and prospective trainers from 10 Caribbean Associations to participate in a training, "Strength and Harmony" organised jointly by the Western Hemisphere Committee and St Vincent and the Grenadines. Two members of the Training Pool to travel to St Vincent to serve on the planning team.

1990 was a special year. Not only was it the 80th anniversary of the Movement, but it also saw the 27th World Conference held in Singapore.

The Conference's theme, Strength and Harmony in Diversity, mirrored the spirit of Thinking Day. It demonstrated how the Movement, with its large and diverse membership, can successfully foster peace, mutual respect and co-operation. Thus, a strong base is provided on which to grow, as well as helping to make the world a better place.

This has always been, and will be, at the heart of Girl Guiding and Girl Scouting - from its inception in 1910, on Thinking Day 1991 and into the 21st Century.

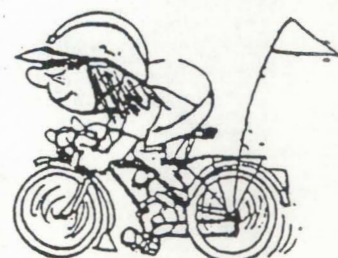
