FREE - BICYCLE SAFETY BOOKLETS AND POSTERS

An excellent 30 page full colour booklet, called "A Simple Guide to Bicycle Safety", targeting parents of 9 to 16 year old children and teachers of bicycle safety, has been produced by the Federal Office of Road Safety. The booklet deals with the need to wear bicycle helmets and protective eye catching clothing when riding, to keep your bicycle safe and to learn rider skills.

There are also three accompanying full colour posters, on helmet wearing, defensive riding and riding at night.

The booklet and posters can be used in conjunction with formal bicycle training or as the basis for discussion on bicycle safety.

OLAVE & ROBERT BADEN-POWELL MEMORIAL TRUST FUND

In these days of increasing unemployment, we believe the role of both leader and commissioner is more demanding in giving support to the girls and their families within your district, but we, the members of the Olave and Robert Baden-Powell Trust Fund, ask that you also give thought to former members of both the guide and scout Movements.

This trust fund was set up for those who have given so much over the years, and now may need some financial help through no fault of their own, but would be too proud to ask. So many people retired on a fixed income, but with inflation, their money has depleted. To explain further, applications for a grant (not a loan), are treated as confidential and the committee act as quickly as possible once a form is received.

The trust deed, drawn up by solicitors for this committee in 1987, reads in part: "The trust is established and shall be maintained exclusively for the purpose of providing money, property and benefits to, for, or on account of indigent members and/or former members (and their dependents) of the Girl Guides Association of Victoria and the Scout Association of Australia, Victorian Branch, in respect of medical, dental, pharmaceutical and like assistance, prostheses, spectacles, hearing aids, wheel chairs, special bedding requirements, walking frames and similar devices, including items not covered by public and/or private health schemes."

Several grants have already been finalised, not all for health reasons. For instance - helping with removal costs when a member of our Association had to vacate premises and transport her possessions to a country town. Also assisting with costs to put an antenna in the ceiling of a nursing home so that a former member, a quadriplegic patient, could have her own television set. This booster once fitted, meant that every other patient in the home could also each have their own television if they required one.

Other applications could be - dangerous trees being lopped, or plumbing pipes being replaced.

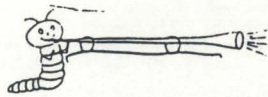

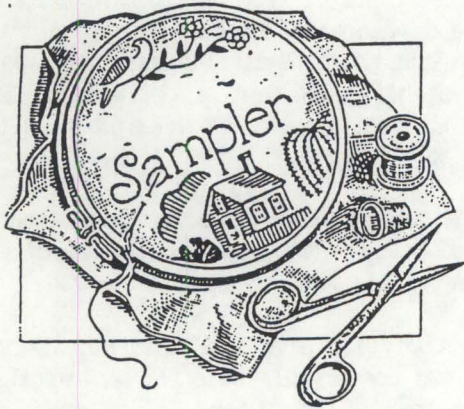
The Ranger Section Debutante Ball is to be held on Friday, 26 July at the Mitcham Function Centre, 494 Maroondah Highway, Mitcham.

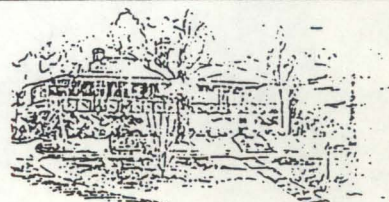
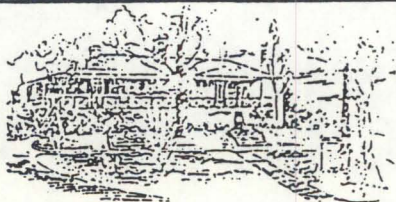

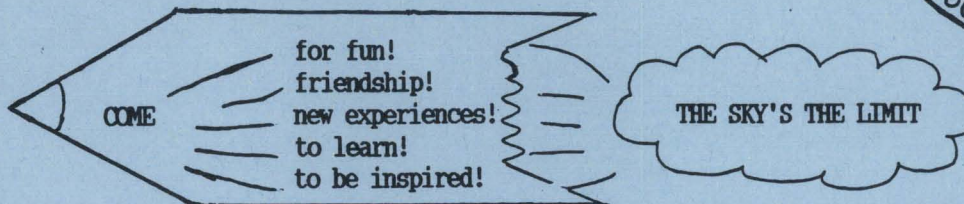
