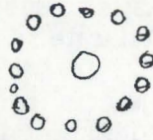

WARRANTS

Commissioners and district leaders - please note:

To comply with Australian Association regulations it is compulsory that all sections of the warrant form should be completed. This also applies to leaders who are changing positions - that is, from leader to assistant leader or vice versa.

If you are sending someone in to collect a warrant for you, please make sure that the form is filled in correctly otherwise you cause a lot of distress with both the office staff and more importantly, your messenger, who has made a wasted trip into headquarters.

CASH TRANSACTION REPORTS ACT 1988

Identification requirements.

Information for Bank Customers:

Purpose of the Act

The Cash Transaction Reports (CTR) Act is legislation which requires banks and their customers to follow new procedures. The objective of the Act is to assist in the detection of criminal activity and tax evasion, especially money laundering and drug trafficking.

In relation to banks, the Act covers four main areas:

- . The elimination of accounts in false names (commenced 1 July 1988)
- . The reporting of suspect transactions (commenced 1 January 1990)
- . The reporting of cash transactions \$10,000 and over (commenced 1 July 1990)
- . The application of identification procedures for accounts including facilities for safe deposits of all kinds (commenced 1 February 1991)

Identification Procedures:

Customers will have to identify themselves when opening or becoming signatories to "accounts" which include:

- . Any passbook or non passbook savings account including those operated by means of plastic cards.
- . All cheque accounts whether in credit or overdrawn.
- . All credit card accounts (Bankcard, Master Card, Visa).
- . Term (fixed) deposits.
- . Deposit boxes or other kinds of safe custody.

The Act does not affect existing customers unless they wish to open an additional account or become signatory to an account or safe custody arrangements.

The Act provides two methods for cash dealers, such as banks, to verify the identity of persons authorised to operate on an account or have access to safe custody facilities.

1. The first method is to produce a reference to the bank from an "acceptable referee". Banks are able to advise who are the Government approved "referees". The referee must have known you for at least 12 months and should sight your passport, birth certificate or citizenship certificate.
2. The second method is to provide the bank directly with evidence of identity.

This method may require the production of more than one piece of evidence to meet the requirements of the Act and the banks.

The most important forms of identification are passport, birth certificate, or citizenship certificate but they are not necessarily sufficient. Other evidence, including such things as driver's licence, pensioner or other benefit cards, credit or debit cards may be accepted in addition to, or instead of, the most important ones. Letters of introduction, identity cards or even such things as rates notices could be useful.

There are special provisions to cater for children under 16 or other categories of persons with limited availability of identification documents.

Under this Act, being a customer for more than 12 months is acknowledged as some evidence of identity, but banks are still required to take additional identification.

Some helpful advice:

If you are opening an account or becoming a signatory on an account, it will assist if you bring as much identification as you conveniently can. Ask at your bank branch for advice as to what would be best in your case.

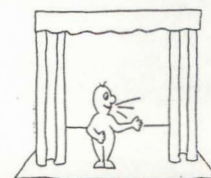

The new Girl Guide Activity Books are now available from the guide shop at a cost of \$3.00 each. These books will replace the 8 Point Cards and are in three parts.

The activity books have pages to record a girls progress through the 8 points.

Girls may complete their current 8 point card or transfer to the relevant Activity Book.

The Australian Guide Handbook is currently being revised (not re-written) removing the activities covered in the activity books, leaving a resource book of guiding skills for patrols. This handbook should be available from the shop soon.

Also available from the shop are the updated B-P Emblem record cards. At present it is Victoria's policy that all B-P Emblem cards are signed by the region commissioner - NOT district leader as in some states.

FROM THE TRAINING DEPARTMENTSnake Bite Treatment

Recently, the training department was asked about snake bite treatment.

The training department base their first aid teachings on both the Red Cross and St John's Ambulance policies.

Both were contacted - both are teaching the same method with no recent changes.

We advise and expect our members to use the same treatment recommended by St John's and Red Cross.

Following is an article printed recently in the "Herald-Sun" by Mr Hutton of St John Ambulance. The article is reprinted with the kind permission of Mr N D Hutton, Marketing Manager, St John Ambulance:

Treatment for Snake Bite is:

"The correct procedures are:

- . Rest and reassure the casualty.
- . Apply a pressure immobilisation bandage over the bitten area and around the limb, using a crepe or conforming bandage about 15cm wide. If unavailable, use pantyhose or other material.
- . Apply the bandage firmly enough to compress tissue, but not so firmly as to restrict the flow of blood.
- . Bandage from the bite to the fingers or toes, up to the armpit or groin.
- . Bandage as much of the limb as possible.
- . Apply a splint to the bandaged limb with a second bandage.
- . Do not remove the splint or bandage and seek medical aid.

Never wash the venom off the skin as this will help in later identification.

Never use a constrictive bandage.

Do not try to catch the snake, however, a description of the snake may assist medical aid.

Never cut or excise the bitten area.

Never try to suck the snake venom out of the wound.

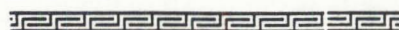

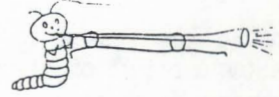

FROM THE STATE TRAINING ADVISER

The Leaders Logbook is now available from the Guide Shop at a cost of \$3.80. All new leaders/commissioners should be given a copy of this booklet and allowed the time to work through the contents at their own individual pace.

The Leaders Logbook (containing the syllabus for 'Orientation' and 'Leadership 1') gives the leader/commissioner, new to guiding, the opportunity to prepare herself with knowledge of the Movement and an understanding of the leadership role she is undertaking before she commences formal training. It also allows the leader with a guiding background to be credited with the knowledge she has already acquired and gives acknowledgement of the abilities and skills each new leader brings to guiding.

A 'Guiding Partner' should be appointed by the District Leader/Commissioner to assist the new leader as she works through the logbook. The 'Guiding Partner' may be any experienced leader who is prepared and able to provide friendly support as the new leader settles into her leadership role.

In some instances the District Leader/Commissioner will undertake this role herself. Certainly the 'Guiding Partner' does not take the place of the District Leader in the early preparation of the new leader, but joins with her to support the new leader.

A booklet for the 'Guiding Partner' will soon be available from the Guide Shop and will give guidelines to assist her to carry out her supportive role.

By working together through the logbook a bond should be formed, between the new leader, the District Leader/Commissioner and the 'Guiding Partner' that will build a support system of understanding, acceptance and team spirit.

When the leader/commissioner has completed 'Orientation' and 'Leadership 1' the District Leader/Commissioner should sign the logbook (page 69).

A certificate which states that the Leader/Commissioner has completed 'Leadership 1' may be purchased from the Guide Shop. The certificate should be presented to the leader/commissioner on a suitable occasion, eg district/division meeting.

Once the leader has completed the Leaders Logbook she is then eligible to attend a Leadership 2 course and should bring the completed logbook with her to that course. Leadership 2 must be completed before a leader can be warranted.

The District Leader/Commissioner attends as her first training the 'District Leader/Commissioner Leadership 2' course.

Trainers who have already planned Leadership courses are bursting with enthusiasm for the new program and I am waiting expectantly to launch these new courses and to receive feedback from the participants. Please write or 'phone me with your comments after you complete a course.

With any change we can expect to have people a little unsure. Changes may bring uncertainty but positive changes are exciting, challenging and a time of opportunity.

I have already visited several areas to discuss and explain the new training program and am only too pleased to answer any queries you may have.

Health and First Aid Clause

The Health and First Aid clause is in two parts -

Part A - Prevention and Precautions

Part B - Practical First Aid including CPR

All leaders wishing to obtain camping qualifications need to attend training in both these areas and then be assessed for the Health and First Aid clause.

Part A is covered in all Campcraft, Ranger Lightweight or Pack Holiday training courses OR you may attend a separate Part A course (details in the Training Calendar).

Part B may be covered by attending First aid training, conducted by the Australian Red Cross Society and organised by the Girl Guides Association Training Department. (See Training Calendar for dates).

Assessment of the Health and First Aid clause is done in Regions - contact your Region Outdoor Activities Co-ordinator for the Assessor's name and address.

If you attend a 20 hour -

course then Part B is automatically covered and no assessment is required. However, Part A will still need to be assessed in your region.
