VICTORIAN SUPPLEMENT TO RULES, POLICY AND ORGANISATION, 1930.

1. GENERAL.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS.—Districts should consider themselves under an obligation to send an annual subscription to Headquarters, the amount to be decided by the Local Association, and sent to Headquarters, if possible, by the 15th September in each year.

BATHING.—Bathing in Victoria shall come under the heading A or B, and shall require one Life-Saver and two Pickets to every party of ten Guides. The division of bathing places into the two categories will be made by the District Commissioner and the Life-Saver.

In all baths where a qualified Life-Saver is actually in attendance at the time, a bathing party may be in charge of one responsible person and two Pickets to every fifteen Guides.

It is urged that Captains see that Guides, when bathing, wear some distinguishing colour on their heads.

This applies to all members of the Guide Movement.

BROWNIE HOLIDAYS.—A Brown Owl may take her own Pack for holidays in furnished houses, subject to the Rules in R.P.&O., and the following ADDITIONAL RULES:—

- The Brown Owl must hold the Camper's Licence or the Camper's Certificate or the Indoor Camp Test Certificate, or be accompanied by a Guider who holds one of these.
- Application must be made at least six weeks before Holiday on the special forms obtainable from the District Commissioner.
- 3. Brown Owls cannot take their Packs for holidays until they have been with the Pack for at least one year.
- A Nurse or other approved person with good general knowledge of sickness must accompany the Pack,

- 5. Written permission must be obtained from the parents.
- 6. Unless accommodated in approved boarding-house, some qualified person must be in charge of the meals.
- 7. No Brownie Holiday may last for more than a week.

CAMPING.—For the sake of a high standard for endorsed Licences, Licences shall not be endorsed on a Guider's first Camp.

GUIDE VISITS.—When Guiders wish to take Guides to stay in other districts, the approval of the Commissioner in both districts must be obtained, this approval to be granted after consultation with the Head of Camping.

THANKS BADGE.—All applications for Thanks Badges should be sent in writing to Headquarters, through the District Commissioner; for consideration and approval of the Executive Committee.

TRAINING.—Trainees under 18 are not accepted at either Training Classes or Weeks.

UNIFORM.—(a) Guiders should, with uniform coats and skirts, wear white blouses. (b) When undress uniform is worn, hats may be turned down and the cockade worn on the crown.

In place of the coat and skirt, Guiders in Victoria may wear a coat-frock (of drill or serge), worn over a white shirt; patterns are available at Headquarters.

II.—TESTS AND BADGES.

From 30th June each year, Tests for all Badges are taken according to the syllabus printed in RULES, POLICY AND ORGANISATION of the current year; the following additions and alterations (adopted for Australia by the Federal Council and approved by the Victorian Executive Committee) take effect in Victoria on the same date.

BROWNIES—SECOND-CLASS TEST.—A Brownie should—

- (a) Know that the Australian Flag shows the world that the States of Australia are united:
- (b) Be able to pick out, in a collection of flags, the Australian Flag.

GUIDES-TENDERFOOT TEST shall include:-

"Knowledge of Australian Flag" (see pamphlet sold at H.Q. for 3d.; note paragraph at foot of page 8 No Guide is expected to learn the measurements of the stars).

SECOND CLASS TEST shall include:-

"Prevention and Cure of Snake Bite."

"Treatment of Burns and Scalds."

(Treatment of snake-bite to be in accordance with the decisions of the Interstate Medical Conference).

FIRST CLASS TEST.—"Knowledge of Neighbourhood" —Commissioners of Districts where Guides are widely scattered are asked to submit for approval suitable alternatives, such as knowledge of crops; what to do in case of bush fires; how to summon the doctor; whereabouts of good water; condition of roads and directions to nearest townships and towns.

RANGERS—TENDERFOOT TEST shall include:—

"Knowledge of Australian Flag" (see pamphlet sold at H.Q. for 3d.; note paragraph at foot of page 8. No Ranger is expected to learn the measurements of the stars).

For Ranger Recruits who are Guides, it is necessary for the whole Test to be taken, not just the three slings.

RANGER TEST (SECOND CLASS) shall include:—

"Prevention and Cure of Snake-Bite" (see above).

For the Ranger Test, which covers such a wide ground, it is not advisable for Ranger Captains, even though they are Warranted, to test in all the possible alternatives. The Commissioner would arrange for suitable people to test the items in which the Captain has not herself qualified. Proficiency Badge Examiners may be used.

In Districts without a Warranted Ranger Captain, the Commissioner will arrange the Ranger Test. Commissioners may apply to the Head of Rangers for people qualified to take the various sections of the Test.

PROFICIENCY BADGES.

The Victorian Executive Committee has made arrangements, through the courtesy of the Societies particularly concerned, for instruction and tests for some of the subjects for which fully qualified people are required.

Badges for which expert instruction is desirable are:-Ampulance; Athlete; Child Nurse; First Aid; Folk Dancer; Gymnast; Nurse; Probationer; Sick Nurse; Swimmer.

AMBULANCE OR FIRST-AIDER.—The St. John Ambulance Association has generously offered to the Guides the co-operation of their voluntary organisation. They are willing to send a qualified instructor to any Company who applies for help, but have asked that all applications shall be sent through Headquarters. ATHLETE AND GYMNAST.—The jumping for these Badges may be particularly harmful if practised without supervision. For these Badges instructors may be appointed locally.

BIRDLOVER-

1.-A Guide must know-

- (a) The likely haunts of birds to be found in any district, selected by herself, and should, during a walk, identify those seen and heard.
- (b) The chief natural dangers to which they are exposed—i.e., from mammals, reptiles or other birds, etc.
- 2.—Must show a year's diary with notes on observations of at least 10 of the species known. Such notes to include:—
 - (a) Date when first seen in district.
 - (b) Whether resident or visitor.
 - (c) General food habits.
 - (d) Notes on nesting, mating (of course, only if it nests in the district).
 - (e) General habits.

3.—Economic Relations of Birds to Man.—

- (a) The value of birds to the farmer or gardener.
- (b) What social customs, ideas or superstitions of man threaten the existence of birds.
- (c) The main features of the Birds and Animals Protection Acts (in their own State).

4. Encouragement and Feeding of Birds .-

(a) Must have done something towards encouraging birds to live near her home (or in her district) without involving danger

- to the birds from cats, etc. This may be done by providing suitable drinking or feeding tins in favourable places.
- (b) Must keep notes on the bird visitors to these tins, such notes to be kept in the year's diary.
- 5. A Guide must show good knowledge of 20 birds, and answer simple questions on the characteristics, song, flight, appearance, etc., by which she has identified them.

BOOK-LOVER.—No abridged editions may be used for this test. "The Little Black Princess" and "We of the Never Never" (Mrs. Aeneas Gunn) shall be added to the list, both volumes to be treated as one book.

COMMITTEE.—Taking of Minutes, and method of entering them in the Minute Book; the drawing up of an Agenda; presentation of a treasurer's balance-sheet; the proper way to take the chair, with a knowledge of the right procedure for calling upon speakers and the putting of resolutions and amendments, methods of voting, wording of resolutions; method of making a concise account of an address or meeting; wording of a newspaper advertisement of a meeting; and

- (a) A three-minute speech to introduce a speaker, or
- (b) a three-minute vote of thanks to a speaker.

DOMESTIC SERVICE.—In addition to the syllabus in R.P. and O.:—"Must sweep and dust verandah or balcony, know how to lessen the fly nuisance, know how to keep clean baths and W.C.'s, and understand the care of the garbage tin."

EMPIRE KNOWLEDGE (RANGERS).—Captain Matthew Flinders shall be added to the list under "Act with her Patrol," etc.

ENTERTAINER.—"Reading Aloud" is now included in the Test. This addition is on trial in Australia for one year.

Guiders are advised to supervise the items to be presented before Guides begin to practise for the Test.

INFANT WELFARE (CHILD NURSE AND NURSE BADGES).— The Victorian Baby Health Centres' Association and the Tweddle Hospital for Babies and School of Mothercraft (Plunket system) have offered to provide qualified instructors in Infant Welfare Work for Guides and Rangers in the Districts in which the Societies severally operate.

Guides should be encouraged to obtain the MOTHERCRAFT CERTIFICATE issued by the Victorian Health Centres' Association. This certificate does not qualify for a badge, but its possession should

be recognised by endorsement of membership cards and company records. Application for an Instructor from the Tweddle Hospital for Babies and School of Mothercraft (Plunket system) should be made to

The fee for a course of ten classes will be in future £1/1/-, with an additional 10/6 for the test. Travelling expenses will be additional. It is suggested that twelve to twenty is a suitable size for a class, and that companies and districts should combine to obtain the services of a Health Centre Sister.

If Guides preparing for the Child Nurse Badge require four or five lectures only because the sections concerning amusement, occupation, diet, etc., are to be taken by a second instructor, a fee of 10/6 will be charged. The fee should also be forwarded to the Head of Tests and Badges not later than the date of the last class.

N.B.—Districts and Companies are responsible for all expenses of travelling and materials incurred by instructors invited to Company meetings or district classes.

NATURALIST.—A further alternative to be inserted between (e) and (f) to read: "Identify 30 wildflowers in the open, and show general knowledge of seeds, growth, families, etc."

We have found by experience that the syllabus for this Badge may be read in various ways. It is suggested that the items should be interpreted as follows:—

Swim 100 Yards, etc.—About equal distances of each stroke to be demonstrated.

Swim 25 Yards in clothes, including skirt and boots.—Skirt should be of woollen material, about knee length. Tunic may be worn for skirt. Shoes may be worn instead of boots, but must be leather-soled walking footwear. Clothing should be usual attire.

- (a) Artificial respiration should include treatment after breathing is apparent.
- (b) Both types of dives should be shown.
- (c) Distance which patient must be brought should be definite; 10 yards is suggested.

Throwing a Life-Line.—The method is the same as that used in throwing a lariat. Scoutmasters are usually able to instruct.
